Further information for students considering a nursing course at Swinburne

Swinburne supports students to make informed choices when applying for and enrolling in courses. In the nursing discipline, there are <u>functional and behavioural abilities</u> required to undertake tasks, learning activities or assessments. These functions are described below to assist prospective students when assessing whether they can successfully undertake the course.

Reasonable Adjustments

Swinburne upholds inclusive academic practices, ensuring that students with disabilities and other conditions can undertake courses and participate in study. Reasonable adjustments can be implemented to support students through viable arrangements to enable students with a disability or a chronic health condition to undertake the studies without undermining core course requirements. Students considering whether they may be eligible for reasonable adjustments should contact Swinburne's <u>AccessAbility Services</u> and will need to complete an <u>AccessAbility Registration Form</u>.

1. Sensory Abilities
